Our staff still gave us things to smile about and celebrate. Here are some of things things we are proud of:



**April 2020:** We gave our first staff Star Award online.

David Fairbairn one of our Porters won it. He won for greeting everyone with the kindest, happiest smile, and the politest greeting.



**May 2020**: We got a Special Achievement Award for how all our staff had dealt with the pandemic.



**June 2020:** We put up a Windrush Day flag over the Huddersfield hospital.



Windrush Day is on 22 June. It celebrates the Windrush ship. The ship brought people from the Caribbean to live in the UK from 1948 to 1971.



August 2020: We started a free Well-Being Hour every week for our staff. This is so they can take some time out at work.



**September 2020**: We started the Unicef Baby Friendly scheme.

This is a set of rules for good baby and children health services.



**October 2020**: Our Endoscopy team is a special group of staff. They put a camera into people's stomachs to have a look what is going on.



The team won a really special award. It was for the fantastic care they give patients in our hospitals.



**November 2020**: We set up a Relatives Line. This is a special phone number for people to contact their family in hospital



We won a special award from Parliament for this too.



**December 2020**: In December we started giving vaccines for COVID-19. The vaccine is an injection that helps protect you against COVID-19.



January 2021: Our staff member Marilyn Rogers is a fantastic Midwife. She helps Mums to feed their babies.

Marilyn won an award from the queen called an MBE. It was for her great work.



**February 2021**: We had given out more than 20 thousand COVID-19 injections. We did this very quickly.

The injections were given to staff from our Trust and to local health care staff.

It is for all our staff who worked extra hard to make it happen.



March 2021: Our Trust won an award at the National Health Heroes Awards.



This was for using phone and video calls really quickly at the beginning of the pandemic. This helped patients to keep connected.
