You are coming for an ultrasound scan.




At the main reception someone can show you the way to the x-ray department.

You should have a card or letter to bring with you.




Give the card or letter to the x-ray receptionist.



You can sit in the waiting room until it is your turn.




Shelley wiping off the gel before she goes

You might have been asked to not eat anything before you come.




You might have to drink some water before your scan too.



You will be asked to lie on a couch.


You will probably need to lift your clothes up a little bit so they can put some gel on your skin.
